

B'klyn duo guilty in pal's slay

TWO BROOKLYN men were convicted of murder Wednesday for luring a former friend to his death with fake flirtatious texts and nude photos.

Ragene Powell-Dickerson, 29, and Jimmy Copeland, 26, were sunk by testimony from Copeland's sister who described the nefarious plot to assassinate Dwayne Burnett.

The 26-year-old victim was shot dead after agreeing to meet with a teen friend of Copeland's sister who invited him for a tryst following a series of sexts.

Instead, Copeland pumped seven bullets at the unsuspecting target in June 2010. Copeland had been promised cash from Powell-Dickerson for the slaying.

The sister and her friend, who sent the sexy text messages, testified at trial after cutting a deal with prosecutors.

The convicted duo is now facing life in prison without parole.

"I'm so happy justice was served. We waited three years," said the victim's sister Lageneva Burnett, 25.
